

MEMBERSHIP RATES

Institutional \$240/yr.

An organization or institution other than the state system of higher education, represented by 4 professional members designated by the organization or institution. Those designated are entitled to vote and are eligible to hold office.

Professional \$80/yr.

Faculty, professional, certificated or other similar salaried staff actively working with students with disabilities.

Associate \$40/yr.

Support service or part-time hourly staff.

Retired \$40/yr.

Support service or part-time hourly staff.

Student/Interns \$18/yr.

Full-time students who do not meet one of the categories above (*verification required*).

Library \$20/yr.

Library faculty or staff employed within systems of higher education.
